

RESOLUTION NO. 18-089, SERIES 2018

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO DEVELOP AND EXECUTE CANNABIS COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND AGREEMENTS WITH DAVIS JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND FIRST 5 YOLO

WHEREAS, in 2017, during creation of the permitting and regulatory structure for cannabis, the City Council created a Cannabis Community Benefit Fund to address potential concerns and adverse conditions associated with the issuance of licenses for cannabis retail businesses; and

WHEREAS, the Cannabis Community Benefit Fund will include funds provided by cannabis businesses and will assist in offsetting primary and secondary effects of retail cannabis businesses; and

WHEREAS, on December 5, 2017 Council passed Resolution No. 17-161, Series 2017 authorizing the City Manager to establish a Community Benefit Fund and to enter into community benefit agreements with property owners holding a retail conditional use permit and cannabis business permit; and

WHEREAS, the City solicited and has received proposals from the Davis Joint Unified School District and First 5 Yolo; and

WHEREAS, said proposals meet the goal of providing education and outreach with particular emphasis on reaching pregnant women, children and adolescents, and parents to address both public health concerns as well as public safety issues related to cannabis use and consumption in the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Davis does hereby authorize the City Manager to develop, with the City Attorney, five-year agreements with Davis Joint Unified School District (DJUSD) and First 5 Yolo for the receipt and use of Cannabis Community Benefit Funds to reflect substantial conformance with proposals submitted, and to execute said agreements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the agreements will allocate 50% of the community benefits collected annually each to DJUSD and First 5 Yolo up to \$50,000 each per year for five years (for a total of up to \$100,000 per year depending upon revenues received by the City). The agreements will include a requirement for each organization to provide an annual report to the City Council on their utilization of the funds. Extension of the agreement can be considered prior to the end of the fifth year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that should community benefit funds exceed \$100,000 in a year, staff will return to Council with a recommendation to allocate those funds to DJUSD and/or First 5 Yolo or to other community needs as may be identified.
