The number of juvenile citations has decreased significantly over the past 5 years. The number of citations was at its lowest in 2020. This could be attributed to the Covid-19 pandemic and the stay at home orders that were issued by the Federal government. 2021 did see an increase in total citations, with 56% (N=5) being Hispanic juveniles. 2021 saw the relaxation of the stay at home order and the return of juveniles into classrooms.
